Confirmation is a program of lectures, discussion and small group meetings for those seeking confirmation in the Episcopal Church and those wishing to reaffirm their confirmation. Confirmation follows the liturgical year from Advent through Pentecost. The class is designed for those who have completed Exploring Membership and seek to enter more deeply into membership and discipleship in the Episcopal Church. Participants discuss significant issues of Christian faith, practice and theology within the framework of the Church's teaching and worship; its understanding of sin, evil and forgiveness; personal and social ethics; and the call to be agents of justice and peace in the world. The program begins each December and concludes with confirmation in May.

EFM is a four year group seminar that goes through Hebrew/Christian Scriptures and church history. As lay persons we face the difficult and often subtle task of interpreting the richness of the church's faith in a complex and confusing world. We need a theological education which supports our faith and also teaches us to express that faith in day-to-day events. Through discussion and guided reflection, the seminar opens the opportunity to deeper understanding on how our lives and actions are part of our rich theological heritage. Group members are part of a small group setting in which the events of each person's life may be examined in the light of the materials being studied. By examining our own beliefs and their relationship to our culture and the tradition of our Christian faith, we can learn what it means to be effective ministers in the world. The program is produced by the University of the South, an Episcopal University. The class meets weekly on a weeknight from September through May. Tuition is approximately \$340 per year.

The Office for Creative Connections (OCC) is a community outreach ministry established as a gift to the City of Pasadena in 1984 by the vestry of All Saints Church. OCC identifies local needs and resources and brings people together around issues of common concern. The OCC methodology consists of listening, discerning, reporting and connecting. This process has led to the creation of (a) Young & Healthy, a health care program for uninsured children, (b) Day One (page 9), an advocacy program that addresses problems and policies related to alcohol and other drugs, (c) CORAL (page 14), an out of school academic and enrichment program for Pasadena children, (d) "Schoolsout.org," an Internet Website listing and describing details about after school programs in Pasadena. It also led to the acquisition and administration of the Coral Innovation Center and its programs. All of these efforts are now separately incorporated into organizations in the City.

Current program areas include:

Transformational Journeys Ministry physical journeys of faith for parishioners, transforming

them through challenging encounters with other local and global communities. (Please see page 36 for a separate listing.)

City Conversations a series of training/dialogue workshops and roundtable discussions in the city with individuals of diverse backgrounds to recognize, understand and appreciate similarities and differences whether they are in race, ethnicity, gender, socio-economic class, orientation or language. The goal is to move toward action that will have long-term impact in the community. City Conversations coordinates (a) **Culture Shock**, a week-long intense training and experience of multiculturalism for Pasadena youth, (b) **Student Dropout Committee**, a high level personnel from PUSD, City and PCC to oversee and coordinate efforts in the prevention and reduction of student dropout in Pasadena and (c) **Community / Police Relations Roundtable**, a collaborative effort to improve relations between the community and the Police Department.

All Saints / Muir Mentoring Project Over 100 parishioners responded to our Rector's call on Easter Sunday 2008 to consider becoming a mentor to a student at John Muir High School. The Rector challenged us to make a difference in the lives of young people by responding to their needs with love and compassion.

The All Saints Muir Mentoring Committee has developed a structure to recruit, equip and support parishioners to become mentors to 9th grade students at John Muir High School. Mentors work through one of several community-based agencies that are experts in matching, training and guiding mentor-student teams. To date, we have 27 All Saints parishioners who are mentoring students at Muir. (Please see page 7 for separate listing.)

All Saints Theatre Camp is a one-week program developed for high school "in crisis" youth of Pasadena in collaboration with Learning Works! Charter School. It provides experiences in acting, singing, stage movement and more. The program accommodates 20-25 youth and is an opportunity to stimulate their creativity, develop self-discipline, confidence and teamwork skills while allowing them to experience the magical world of theatre and performance. The camp takes place at All Saints Church and utilizes the rich resources of theatre professions and patrons of the arts within the All Saints Community. (Please see page 8 for a separate listing.)

The Youth Ministry at All Saints Church exists to serve youth by creating a safe, nurturing environment in which to explore issues of faith. By challenging them to be in community with one another and integrating social justice with spiritual formation, they are empowered to make the world a better place. Youth Ministry programs include:

The Journey gets bumpy at times . . . Sundays at 10:15 a.m. we get together, share a doughnut or two, and explore what it means to be a Christian. We focus on faith and doubt, the Bible, the Episcopal Church, current events, and the peace and justice issues facing our community. Volunteers are needed to help facilitate.
